		<p>Context:</p> <p>James Palmer, Chair of the Interdepartmental Executive Board will set out the requirements for NZ to communicate its second Nationally Determined Contribution (NDC2) to the UNFCCC by 10 February 2025. This will be New Zealand's international climate mitigation target covering the period 2031-2035. Under the Paris Agreement rules, it is required to be a progression on NDC1 and should reflect our judgement of New Zealand's highest possible ambition. The Government has choices about how it sets NDC2 and what factors to prioritise in this decision.</p> <p>James will also provide a progress update on NDC2 and present a range of options for Ministers to discuss. Analysis of New Zealand's position with respect to international peers is being undertaken as part of this work.</p> <p>Risks and issues:</p> <p>NDC2 decisions should consider a range of factors including New Zealand's contribution to the Paris Agreement's global temperature goals (noting we are a developed country so will be expected to do more than the global average), the cost and feasibility of delivering a target, and international reputation and standing against other countries. There are trade-offs between these factors - the more ambitious a target, the more it supports the global effort but the higher cost and challenge to deliver.</p> <p>Supporting papers:</p> <p><i>Draft Cabinet Paper</i></p> <p>Note the advice provided by the Climate Change Interdepartmental Executive Board</p>

1	<p>Board-only time / context sharing</p> <p>The Chair opened the meeting and noted the apologies received.</p> <p>OSC update</p> <p>The Chair noted he had attended the Officials Strategy Committee (OSC) meeting last week to discuss the Target 9 A3 going to the Cabinet Strategy Committee (STR) on 22 October.</p> <p>OSC were comfortable with the material and general positioning that we are on track for EB1, and that the proposed package of policies in ERP2 is sufficient to meet EB2 at this stage.</p> <p>OSC noted that dynamic economic variables may impact on current tracking, which would require Ministers to explore options to further reduce emissions. These have been worked on collectively and are reflected in the advice on ERP2.</p> <p>The Minister of Climate Change (MCC) has indicated he would like to focus on Target 9 alone at the STR discussion, leaving EB3 projections and NDC conversations for ministerial meetings in December.</p> <p><i>[Further minutes were not taken in Board-only time]</i></p>	
2	<p>Adaptation Framework update</p> <p>Lead: Nadeine Dommissie (MfE)</p> <p>The Chair noted that the ministerial meeting with the Independent Reference Group, which had been scheduled for 15 October, was deferred. The papers circulated ahead of the planned ministerial meeting have highlighted for Ministers the need to understand how their portfolios intersect with adaptation. Bilateral meetings are being arranged between the MCC and key colleagues, to discuss how their work programmes can contribute to the Adaptation Framework.</p> <p>MfE's Adaptation team proposes to work with the Climate DCEs group to collate data to help build the economic case for investment, particularly around infrastructure and investment in risk reduction. The intention is to understand what information agencies already have to quantify the benefit from investment in infrastructure. The Board would like a report back on this.</p> <p><i>[Continued on next page]</i></p>	<p>MfE Adaptation team to work with Climate DCEs to collate data to help build economic case for investment, particularly around infrastructure and investment in risk reduction, with report back to Board to follow.</p> <p>Lead: MfE Adaptation team (with agencies)</p>

	<p>Discussion points:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Given the amount of infrastructure investment across government, the scope of work needs to be clearly defined. It is intended that the scope of work will be aligned to the built environment and Government priorities, particularly work programmes coming to a Ministerial decision point over the next nine months. Alignment with Treasury Infrastructure unit and the Regional Infrastructure Fund will be important in defining the scope of work. Discussed whether the bilateral approach was the most effective way to engage Ministers or whether needed to get a group of Ministers together so Ministers could lay out their ambition in this space and surface any difference in opinion. Noted that CPMG in the new year will need to be an adaptation focused meeting. <p>The Board:</p> <p>2.1 noted the proposal for MfE's Adaptation team to work with climate agencies to compile an evidence base on the long-term economic benefits from near-term investment in resilience, with a particular focus on infrastructure, including hazard protection infrastructure</p> <p>2.2 noted the Climate DCEs will coordinate the work to collate data across agencies and will undertake a scoping exercise before providing a report back to the Board.</p>	
3	<p>NDC update (verbal update on NDC1; progress update on NDC2) Lead: Sam Buckle (MfE)</p> <p><u>NDC1 and international climate mitigation update</u></p> <p>Noted COP29 in November, followed by the first Biennial Transparency Report (BTR) due before the end of 2024, which will be first time New Zealand has officially reported on progress towards NDC1.</p> <p>For COP, the Minister will have a narrative about how we are tracking against domestic targets, the ERP2 discussion document and the sense of direction for ERP2. This will include how we are supporting international cooperation.</p> <p>The BTR is due at the same time as ERP2 It also will include a narrative that captures both the domestic and international progress towards meeting NDC1. A high-level narrative on progress towards international cooperation under Article 6 of the Paris Agreement is also being developed. This includes identifying potential cooperation activities, establishing working level relationships, and building capacity for market engagement. The BTR notes there is potential for these partnerships to result in access to international markets in the future.</p> <p>6(a)</p> <p>We are looking to align the data so we have the same story about how we are tracking towards targets.</p> <p>Discussion points: The Board discussed whether the NDC narrative could outline New Zealand's intention to work with the agricultural industry on technological innovations, given half of New Zealand's emissions are from agriculture, highlighting the commitment to making reductions where achievable.</p> <p>It was noted that this would need careful consideration and would fit with a longer-term narrative.</p>	

	<p><u>NDC2 update</u></p> <p>New Zealand's NDC2 needs to be submitted to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) by 10 February 2025. It is expected that this will be a progression of NDC1, outlining New Zealand's highest level of ambition.</p> <p>The MCC is looking to align New Zealand's international commitment with the domestic emissions budget as much as possible, noting challenges related to long-term emissions reduction.</p> <p>MfE is working on options for a range of scenarios that will allow consistency with the expectation that New Zealand's NDC2 is a progression of NDC1.</p> <p>The MCC intends to have bilateral meetings with key colleagues to discuss the approach and intends to submit a paper to Cabinet in December, or by early February 2025 at the latest, to meet timings for NDC2 submission to the UNFCCC.</p> <p>Discussion points:</p> <p>The Board noted the challenges for coalition Ministers to navigate in setting New Zealand's NDC2, including the tight timeframe as well as timing considerations for Cabinet discussions.</p> <p>9(2)(f)(iv)</p> <p>The Board noted that the December CPMG meeting will be focused on NDC2. Encouraging Ministers to prioritise attendance will be important given the tight timeframes.</p> <p>Having a list of countries with an emissions profiles similar to New Zealand, including their intentions around setting the next NDC2, would be useful for Ministers e.g. the small advanced economies.</p> <p>9(2)(h)</p> <p>The Chair noted the Board will discuss NDC further at their next meeting, ahead of the CPMG meeting in December.</p> <p>The Board:</p> <p>3.1 noted New Zealand's NDC2 is due with the UNFCCC by 10 February 2025</p> <p>3.2 noted initial options prepared for the Minister of Climate Change on NDC2</p> <p>3.3 provided feedback on how to frame NDC2 options for Ministers ahead of ministerial bilaterals, CPMG discussion, and Cabinet consideration.</p>	<p>9(2)(f)(iv)</p>
4	<p>Target 9 and landing ERP2</p> <p>Lead: Sam Buckle (MfE) / Jane White (CCIEB Unit)</p> <p>The Board noted the Target 9 report has been endorsed by DCEs for submission to DPMC today. The report has also gone to the MCC for approval today.</p> <p>Additional feedback can be provided to the Climate IEB Unit for inclusion in the final report before it is provided to DPMC.</p> <p><i>[Continued over page]</i></p>	

	<p>The Board has received a copy of the A3 which MCC will be using to lead a discussion on Target 9 at the STR meeting on 22 October. ERP2 is the critical deliverable for achieving Target 9. The Board has also received the Quarterly Progress Report, which includes Target 9 upcoming milestones, and a six-monthly update on tracking towards ERP1 and NAP1.</p> <p>The MCC has received the proposed amendment to ERP1, which includes 41 actions, for approval.</p> <p>Careful consideration will be needed for how best to present ERP2 modelling information. An adaptive approach is needed, considering ahead of time any potential opportunities for additional abatement that could be explored in the event of headwinds. The plan needs to demonstrate that potential opportunities have been considered and there is potential to achieve additional abatement if needed.</p> <p>The Board:</p> <p>4.1 noted the intention to take ERP2 through Cabinet in early November and support portfolio Ministers to engage with the ERP2 document to enable this.</p> <p>4.2 noted the October Quarterly Progress Report, which has been endorsed by Climate DCEs on the Boards' behalf and contains the quarterly Target 9 report – covering the period ending 30 September 2024.</p>	
5	<p>5.1 Response to the Climate Change Commission's progress report on the National Adaptation Plan Lead: Jane White (CCIEB Unit)</p> <p>The Board has received a copy of the draft Government response to the Climate Change Commission's (the Commission) progress report on the National Adaptation Plan.</p> <p>In line with DCEs feedback, the draft response is centred around the Government's climate strategy. An updated table of actions is included with the draft response.</p> <p>The MCC must table a response to the Commission's report by 2 February, and the Climate IEB Unit is working with MCC's office on how to proceed, given Cabinet decisions on the Adaptation Framework have been deferred to the new year, and the response to the CCC report is going in the same Cabinet paper.</p> <p>The Board:</p> <p>5.1 noted the response to the Climate Change Commission's progress report on the National Adaptation Plan</p> <p>5.2 noted the Climate IEB Unit is working with the office of the Minister of Climate Change on how to progress the Government response, which must be tabled in Parliament by 2 February 2025.</p>
