Fast track consenting to remain.</li> <li>Legislation to be sent out shortly specifically around fast track consenting.</li> <li>Interested in what new direction means and the extent to which it slides down to local significant matters.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Fast Track Consenting (FTC) <ul> <li>Fast track consenting focuses on projects that have Regional and National public benefits.</li> <li>Officials are currently in the process of providing advice to Ministers around what a FTC regime may potentially look like.</li> <li>Treaty Settlements – Clear these are to be upheld.</li> <li>Additional protections we may be able to be imbed into legislation and could include how we protect interests and whatever might incur.</li> <li>Government would like to introduce this in the next couple of weeks hence these conversations to engage with PSGEs as early as possible to provide feedback to Ministers.</li> <li>Difficult to say what exact projects will be in legislation, currently in the process of building criteria.</li> <li>Listed project in development, still have select committee process to go through.</li> <li>Two pathways Nationally and Regional, still needs to go through a panel. Can apply to Minister to be passed off to expert consenting panel, new reigime will be similar to fast track covid consenting.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>		



		Nga Potiki perspective
		<ul> <li>Without exception all major infrastructure projects have been taken from Māori,</li> <li>Port, rail, roads, airport, wastewater treatment plant, rubbish tip, sports facilities,</li> </ul>
		water catchments, quarry, treatment plant etc.
		<ul> <li>Nga Potiki are currently looking to do extensive housing developments this FTC may be helpful for moving the project along.</li> </ul>
		• Would like to see progress with FTC but not at the expense of Te Taiao.
		• Needs to be balance and some type of audit to make sure the environment is safe.
		• Water, roads and rail does cause some form of anxiety.
		<ul> <li>How you get checks in place is very important if consenting will be fast. May not benefit everyone.</li> </ul>
		• Hui to wrap up by 8 February if more hui required MFE officials are happy to have another
		hui.
