

## Zero Carbon Bill - Weekly Update: Monday 16 July - Friday 20 July

## Overall Status - Key messages

- A. Alternative schedule options were developed this week. These were discussed in detail with Cross-Agency Climate Change Directors and in overview with the Minister. These will be further refined for review by Cross-Agency Climate Change Directors (25 July) and for a final decision by the Minister (1 August). Until a decision has been made, the team are progressing with timeframes based on a two Cabinet Paper (and RIS) approach. The first will include decisions on adaptation and the Climate Commission to Cabinet on 1 October and decisions on the 2050 target and emissions budget to Cabinet on 5 November.
- B. The final consultation meetings/hui were held this week. This included meetings with the Federation of Māori Authorities (FOMA) (17 July) and Victoria University of Wellington Students Association (17 July). Questions asked included the representation of iwi/māori on the Commission, with suggestions that this should be pre-requisite competency for all members rather than having a single representative. The suggested alternative was an equivalent iwi/māori focused board. In total there have been 16 public meetings, 5 Dairy NZ workshops, 5 youth events, 3 technical workshops and 2 focused workshops as well as participation in events organized by others.
- A. As at 8.30am Friday 20<sup>th</sup> 12,395 submissions have been received (up from 8,642 last week). Note that we are yet to check for duplicates or 'submissions' that are just questions about the submissions process, or make a decision about which, if any, late submissions will be accepted. Approximately 70% are form submissions. 10,487 (85%, up from 99% last week) submissions have been processed. The majority of submissions from organisations were received in the last 2 days. This includes submissions from at least seven iwi and the Federation of Māori Authorities.
