## **Climate Change Commission: expertise considerations**

- 1. As discussed with officials this week, this briefing seeks your decision on a list of expertise considerations for the appointment of the proposed Climate Change Commission, for inclusion in the Cabinet paper for the Zero Carbon Bill.

- 3. Appendix 1 contains a list of all of the above considerations for your feedback.
- Note that matters specified in the Crown Entities Act 2004 will also apply. Under section 29
  of the Crown Entities Act,
  - (1) A responsible Minister of a statutory entity must appoint, or recommend the appointment of, members...in accordance with any criteria for members and any process for appointment under this or another Act.
  - (2) A responsible Minister—
    - (a) may only appoint or recommend a person who, in the responsible Minister's opinion, has the appropriate knowledge, skills, and experience to assist the statutory entity to achieve its objectives and perform its functions; and
    - (b) subject to subsection (1), in appointing or recommending an appointment, must take into account the desirability of promoting diversity in the membership of Crown entities.
- 5. Section 30 of the Crown Entities Act also lists circumstances which would disqualify a person from being appointed as a member of a statutory entity.

### Recommendations

- 1. We recommend that you:
  - a. **Indicate** a preference to include or exclude each of the considerations listed in Appendix 1.
  - b. **Direct** officials to include the preferred expertise considerations in the revised Cabinet paper.
