Thank you for your emails of 1 and 17 September 2024 requesting the following under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act) from the Ministry for the Environment (the Ministry):

- 1. For the reported 2022/23 financial year expenditure of \$822,362 involving internal conferences and seminars, staff retreats, off-site training, or planning and teambuilding exercises, for events over \$20,000:
 - a. The name and a brief description of the event.
 - b. The Date: The date or time frame when the event occurred.
 - c. A Cost Breakdown: A detailed breakdown of the receipts and any other relevant costs.
 - d. The Purpose: The primary purpose or objective of the event, including the intended outcomes.
- 2. For all polling, surveys, research and strategy's from the 2022/23 financial year:
 - a. The name and a brief description of each including contractors company name.
 - b. The Date: The date or time frame when each occurred.
 - c. A Cost Breakdown: The contracts and invoices for each external contractor
 - d. The Purpose: The primary purpose or objective of each, including the outcomes and findings. Please include any internal correspondence for the reasoning behind choosing each contractor and any report or correspondence explaining the reasoning for each service been tendered

I have provided a response to Question 1 in the appendix below:

- Table 1 provides information in response 1a, 1b, and 1d. This information was sourced from contracts and internal correspondence.
- Table 2 provides information in response to 1c. This information is based on an analysis of the transactions supporting the 2022/23 annual review response for expenditure involving internal conferences and seminars, staff retreats, off-site training, or planning and team-building exercises.

I have provided a response to Question 2 in the appendix and by providing you with a range of documents:

- Table 3 provides information in response to part of 2a (the name) and 2b.
- The attached documents provide you with contracts, invoices, procurement plans, and appointment memos in response to the remainder of 2a, 2c, and 2d excluding;
 - o *"outcomes and findings"* for five of the contracts
 - \circ correspondence.

Some of the information in these documents has been withheld under the following sections of the Act:

9(2)(a) to protect the privacy of natural persons

- 9(2)(b)(ii) to protect information where the making available of the information would likely unreasonably prejudice the commercial position of the person who supplied or who is the subject of the information.
- 9(2)(g)(i) to maintain the effective conduct of public affairs through the free and frank expression of opinions by employees of any public service agency in the course of their duty
- 9(2)(k) to prevent the disclosure or use of official information for improper gain or improper advantage.

I am refusing "*outcomes and findings*" in Question 2d for Contracts 26079, 26178, 26308, 26431, and 26437 under section 18(d) of the Act as they are already publicly available at: <u>https://www.parliament.nz/resource/en-NZ/54SCENV_EVI_7f24c5a7-80b8-48d1-767d-08dc00eb6a20_ENV9545/be4a6d24a7f4dd860292bd7b95c7c60979db4887 or <u>https://environment.govt.nz/publications/local-government-climate-data-needs-report/</u>.</u>

I am refusing the correspondence part of Question 2d under section 18(f) of the Act as this would require a substantial amount of consultation and collation. However, I have responded to the part of this question that asks for *"any report explaining the reasoning for each service been tendered"* by providing you with contracts, procurement plans, and memos.

You will notice that Contracts 26431 and 26437 share a procurement plan, alongside two other planned contracts, due to dependencies across the work. These projects were designed to support development of a planned initiative named the Climate Action Hub, and more broadly to support the development of other Emissions Reduction Plan and National Adaptation Plan actions. The work also informed foundational work for the All-of-Government Climate Data Initiative, which was funded through Budget 2023:

- Procurement #1 resulted in Contract 26431 and is listed as Stage 1 in the contract document.
- Procurement #2 was referenced in the contract document for 26431 as Stage 2. This work did not proceed to contract. It was listed in the FY22/23 Annual Review in error, titled "Climate narrative framing and message testing".
- Procurement #3 resulted in Contract 26437.
- Procurement #4 did not proceed to contract.

Contract 26005 was excluded from the Annual Review in error. It should have been included with the title "Climate Narrative Framing and Testing".

You have the right to seek an investigation and review by the Office of the Ombudsman of my decision to withhold information relating to this request, in accordance with section 28(3) of the Act. The relevant details can be found on its website at: www.ombudsman.parliament.nz.
