

SCHEDULE 1

Projects of National or Regional Significance

- Oakleigh to Marsden Point Railway
- Brynderwyn SH1 resilience upgrade including an alternate route
- Grenada to Petone Road
- Second Mt Victoria tunnel
- Western Water Supply Programme, Watercare
- Southwest Wastewater Scheme, Watercare
- Hananui aquaculture project (Ngāi Tahu Seafood salmon farm project in Foveaux Strait)
- Mussel spat collection sites continuation, Wainui Bay, Golden Bay
- Waihi North Project
- Buller Plateau Project (Stockton mine as the mining and infrastructure hub with satellite areas of mining across the Buller Plateaux)
- Macraes Phase Four (expansion of existing Macraes Gold Project)
- Rotowaro Mine Continuation Project (Rotowaro Mine as the mining and infrastructure hub supplying Glenbrook steel plant)
- Waiinu energy farm, Taranaki
- Thelands, solar project, Waikato
- Waitaha Hydro Scheme (Westpower and Poutini Ngai Tahu)

It is implicit that projects that obtain consents under this Act are implemented without delay, and the risk of “consent banking” is minimised. Clauses 38(7) and (8) of Schedule 6 to the COVID-19 Recovery (Fast-track Consenting) Act 2020 included a two year maximum lapse period. They are shown below for reference and could be added to this Bill at clause 15 if desired:

- (7) The decision must also specify the date on which a resource consent or designation lapses unless it is given effect to by the specified date.
- (8) The date specified under subclause (7) must not be later than 2 years—
 - (a) from the date of commencement, in the case of a resource consent; or
 - (b) from the date on which a designation is included in a district plan.
