## 2. Material for you to be aware of this week

---

### Domestic

#### 2.1. Auckland Council Partnership on Climate Change

The Ministry for the Environment has agreed a partnership with Auckland Council to collaborate on climate action. This came about through the Transition Hub's work to identify partners to progress action on climate change.

Contributing around 20% of our national emissions, Auckland will be a key player in shifting New Zealand to net zero, so this is a great opportunity to work with local government to progress shared goals around climate change.

The partnership will centre on two key pieces of our respective work programmes:


- the Council's Climate Action Plan (an integrated adaptation and mitigation strategy for Auckland)
- the Government's climate change work programme, especially the Transition Hub's work programme and advice on transitioning to net zero emissions by 2050.

We will also work together on climate finance, adaptation, corporate sustainability and communications and engagement. The proposed joint launch of the Zero Carbon Bill consultation with the Auckland Climate Action Plan is an example of how we collaborate to support each other's work.

We will keep you updated of progress with this partnership and opportunities to support the Government's climate change work programme.

### 2.3. Fonterra Brightwater boiler to be converted from coal to co-fire biomass

Fonterra and the Ministry for the Environment partnered on the Roadmap to Transition to a Low Emissions Future (the Roadmap) in November 2017. The Roadmap outlines Fonterra and government actions to help large energy users' transition off fossil fuels for process heat requirements and onto renewable energy sources.

On Wednesday 2 May, Fonterra announced that it would convert its existing coal boiler at the Brightwater dairy factory by October 2018, after a successful 2017 trial. The boiler conversion is set to reduce Brightwater factory's carbon dioxide emissions by 25 per cent, equivalent to 2,400 tonnes per year or taking 530 cars off the road.

As part of the Roadmap, Fonterra was scheduled to convert one of its sites to enable co-firing of wood biomass with coal by 2019. But, with support and funding from EECA, Fonterra has been able to deliver this project ahead of the initial 2019 target. In December 2017, Fonterra completed the first action agreed to under the roadmap, which was to identify a range of energy efficiency solutions for existing dairy plant processes. The Brightwater boiler conversion is the second significant milestone as part of our partnership to a low emissions future.

Bioenergy Association chief executive, Brian Cox has commended Fonterra for completing the co-firing action ahead of the 2019 target and stated that "The move to wood biomass as an energy source signals a confidence in the bioenergy sector and is good news for the wood-fuel supply market."

The Roadmap Governance Group containing senior officials from Fonterra, MfE and the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment will meet next week to discuss progress on agreed Roadmap actions, future partnership opportunities and how the Roadmap will move forward. We have been in touch with Treasury about the potential role of the Green Investment Fund in financing further fuel switching opportunities. We will keep you updated on future developments.

### 2.4. Consumer NZ Website

The Consumer New Zealand Website has a free guide to woodburners, which explains how woodburners work and compares woodburner efficiency by using the AS/NZS 4012/4013 test method from within the Air Quality National Environmental Standard (NESAQ).

However, the guide raises concerns about the NESAQ, including that "the very test that woodburners must pass to ensure they meet the standard actually results in them burning dirtier than they should when they're used in everyday conditions". It recommends that regulators develop a test fuel and testing method that more closely matches typical firewood, and the way householders normally operate their burners. The guide states that a new Method (CM1), sponsored by Environment Canterbury (ECAN), could be the solution.

We recommend that officials correspond with Consumer NZ about their concerns and advise

them that we will have an opportunity to look at issues such as the woodburner efficiency test within the NESAQ as part of the upcoming review.

## 2.5. US sea-level rise author visiting Auckland

US journalist Jeff Goodell will attend the Auckland Writers' Festival later this month (15 - 20 May). His 2017 book "The Water Will Come: Rising Seas, Sinking Cities, and the Remaking of the Civilised World" reports how during this century global landscapes will be transformed, and hundreds of millions of people will retreat inland as coasts are inundated. His writing highlights the extreme consequences of inevitable sea-level rise, and he has said that he's prepared for this visit by researching impacts in New Zealand. He has already had advance media coverage on RNZ and Newstalk ZB, and will almost certainly attract more attention when he arrives.

Although Goodell's message concentrates on extreme impacts, it aligns fundamentally with ours (as expressed in the updated guidance on Coastal Hazards and Climate Change): that sea level rise is inevitable and will have severe consequences. The guidance provides information and recommends good practice to avoid the worst consequences within New Zealand's current legislation. The CCATWG Stocktake report identified barriers to good adaptation within the current framework, and their final report may recommend actions to address these.

## 2.6. Review of European climate change risk assessments

Last week, the European Environment Agency (EEA) published a review of how the 33 member countries (including the 28 European Union Member States) have assessed the risks from climate change, and how they used this information in developing adaptation policies. Almost all European countries have conducted national climate change vulnerability and risk assessments as part of their adaptation plans to better deal with the impacts of climate-related hazards.

The report finds that national assessments that evaluate vulnerabilities and risks from climate change to various sectors form the most important source of information for the development of national climate adaptation policies. This aligns well with our proposals for future work on adaptation. The findings of the review will be used by MfE to inform the development of these proposals. ## International

### 2.7. Climate change negotiations in Bonn

The regular mid-year subsidiary body meetings of the UNFCCC got underway this week. Looking ahead to COP24, it is hoped the meetings will make progress in the technical negotiations of the Paris Agreement implementation guidelines, s 9(2)(g)(i)

Areas of interest in the first week include:

- Tensions over modalities for finance (forecast expenditure by developed countries under Article 9.5 of the Paris Agreement);
- whether a proposed additional negotiating session for September will be confirmed and, if so, what issues will be on the agenda;
- a focus on pre-2020 action, aired in the opening of the Talanoa Dialogue and a continued push for entry into force of the Doha Amendment to the Kyoto Protocol.

New Zealand has led efforts to kick start activities under the new Koronivia Joint Work on Agriculture. The delegation has also been working with other interested countries to plan for the proposed Agriculture and Climate Change event at COP24.

Fiji, as current COP President, has advised that Prime Minister Frank Bainamarama plans to travel to Bonn and attend the negotiating session on 8 May, providing high-level support for Fiji's chairmanship.

Poland, as COP24 President, has sent invitations to all Heads of State/Heads of Government to attend the opening of the conference on 3-4 December. This would be in addition to the usual High-Level Segment that Ministers attend at the end of the conference. Officials will provide advice closer to the time on participation.

## **2.8. Inaugural meeting of the 2050 pathways partnership (2050PP)**

A New Zealand official participated in the inaugural meeting of the 2050 pathways partnership (2050PP) in Paris, 24-25 April. The 2050PP was launched in Marrakech at COP22 as a platform for exchanges on long-term, low-emission development strategies. Amongst other things, the meeting touched on:

- The benefits of enhancing vertical alignment of actors engaging in long-term strategy work (states, local government, and NGOs) to improve policy alignment;
- opportunities to work with business organisations (e.g. We Mean Business; the B team; World Business Council for Sustainable Development) to identify compelling narratives to help broaden the support base for transformative action.

Laurence Tubiana (former French chief climate negotiator and now CEO, European Climate Foundation) gave a keynote address. This noted her warm interaction with Prime Minister Ardern and thanked New Zealand for championing the Towards Carbon Neutrality Coalition. A presentation on the approach to developing a 2050 target and Zero Carbon legislation in New Zealand generated considerable interest.

## **2.9. Global Climate Action Summit: update**

The UNFCCC hosted a briefing during the Bonn meetings on the Global Climate Action Summit (GCAS) which will be held in September in San Francisco. Each of the 3 speakers (Patricia Espinosa for the UNFCCC, Anirban Ghosh of the Mahindra Group, and Nick Nuttall, Communications Director for the GCAS) spoke about the need for an increase in the ambition of non-party stakeholders to support the UNFCCC process. It was noted that a number of reports on the impact of non-party stakeholder actions will become available in coming months to support the Summit with "real world numbers" calculating the impact of non-party climate actions. The Summit will focus on five key areas: healthy energy systems, inclusive economic growth, sustainable communities, land stewardship and transformative climate investments. A number of other challenges would be canvassed, including those focused on the financial and tech sectors. Summit organisers are aiming to have an agenda available later in May.

## 1. Material for you to be aware of this week

---

### Domestic

#### 1.1. Local Government New Zealand (LGNZ) launching legal toolkit on Climate Change and Natural Hazards Decision Making

In the week of 14 May, LGNZ plans to release a legal toolkit on Climate Change and Natural Hazards Decision Making. The toolkit aims to advise councils on their ability to limit new, and extensions to existing developments in natural hazard areas. We understand it updates and replaces legal advice from Simpson Grierson, previously available on LGNZ's website. The previous advice did not specifically address climate change, but the new toolkit will likely reference managing the effects of climate change on things such as coastal hazards (on which MfE has recently published guidance), flooding and debris flow hazards (such as in Matakā).

LGNZ plans to brief the Ministry for the Environment on the toolkit next week, and will be promoting it to their members via a series of webinars about minimising the effects of climate change. We will provide further information on this toolkit to your office in the week beginning 14 May (once we receive an embargoed copy from LGNZ).

#### 1.2. Climate Change Adaptation Technical Working Group release

You and the Climate Change Adaptation Technical Working Group (CCATWG) will publicly release the CCATWG final options report at a media and stakeholder event on Thursday 24 May at the Wharewaka.

The purpose of the event is to promote awareness of the report and its findings, build momentum around the need to take action to adapt to climate change and encourage people to submit on the Zero Carbon Bill.

You will open the event, introduce the speakers and hand over to co-chair Judy Lawrence and Tina Porou, Lead Technical Advisor to the Iwi Advisors' Group. They will hand the report to you and then both speak. They will be followed by Dave Cull from Local Government New Zealand. You will then thank the speakers and make closing remarks. Media and stakeholder questions will follow.

You will receive the final options report on Thursday 17 May from the CCATWG Secretariat along with the launch communications plan, the draft media release and backpocket Qs and As.

MfE will provide talking points for this event on Thursday 17 May.

#### 1.3. Inter-agency workshop on the Just Transition

On 9 May, the Ministry for Business, Innovation and Enterprise held an interagency workshop to help build a shared understanding of what a just transition will look like. The workshop allowed agencies to identify key linkages and dependencies between work on transitioning to net zero emissions economy, future of work and the development of the Government's economic strategy. Discussions also focused on what supporting measures and changes were needed to achieve a successful just transition. The Ministry for Business, Innovation and Enterprise Agencies will continue to develop the just transition work programme with agencies.

## 1.4. Estimates Hearing 2018-19

The Estimates Hearing is scheduled for Thursday 14 June. It seems this is going to be split into two sessions, discussing environment from 10:00 – 10:45am, and climate change from 10:45 – 11:15am. We will have further discussions with you and your office in the coming weeks to discuss what you need from MfE to prepare for the hearing.

Minister Parker's office is required to submit the questions and answers requested by the Finance and Expenditure Committee to Select Committee on Friday 18 May. The draft questions and answers have been prepared and are currently with Minister Parker's office to review. We have recommended that he shares the final submission with you prior to delivering it to the Clerk of the Committee.

## International

### 1.5. Bonn Climate Change Negotiations

The Bonn meetings have finished. The co-chairs of the Paris Agreement Work Programme have been given a mandate to create additional tools to assist in the progress of the work programme, and to produce a reflections note that addresses progress made to date and proposing ways forward. An extra negotiating session will be held in Bangkok from 3 to 8 September. Polish Energy Minister Michael Kurtyka has also been designated as COP24 President.

The New Zealand delegation conducted further advocacy on the COP24 agriculture and climate change event, receiving positive feedback from a number of developed agricultural exporting delegations, as well as the Fijian COP Presidency. Outside the negotiations, the Global Research Alliance was acclaimed in a meeting of the Group of Friends of MRV/Transparency.

The Talanoa Dialogue was positive. s 6(a), s 9(2)(j)

At Bonn, Business and Industry NGOs signalled their priorities are: the just transition (emphasising transformation and innovation as well as labour issues); the transparency framework (as a platform for informal business led transparency initiatives to build on); and the Art 6.4 market mechanism, including a call for measures to prevent excess units circulating in the market.

### 1.6. "Just transition for all" side-event – Bonn Climate Change negotiations

On 5 May the New Zealand delegation (Treasury) attended a side-event "Just Transition for All". The event included a presentation by NGO Bread for All defining the principles of a Just Transition. Based on research focusing on energy sector transitions, Bread for All developed the following eight principles of a "just" transition:

#### Climate Dimension:

1. The transition reflects the ambition to achieve zero greenhouse gas emissions by 2050
2. The transition is closely aligned with the SDG implementation

#### Socio-economic dimension:

3. The transition creates decent work in sustainable infrastructure development, supports those losing jobs, and strives to reduce climate risks of climate vulnerable people
4. The transition seeks to positively impact social equity

- The transition is gender-sensitive and contributes to gender equality

Political dimension:

- The transition ensures multi-stakeholder participation
- Good governance (including transparency and accountability) is ensured
- Human rights are respected, protected and fulfilled in the transition.

### 1.7. Electric Vehicles Initiative

MBIE and EECA have submitted a briefing to Minister Woods, proposing that New Zealand join the Electric Vehicles Initiative (EVI) in time for the Clean Energy Ministerial EVI Advisory Board Meeting in Copenhagen on 24 May. If approved, EECA and MBIE would coordinate in order to fund and facilitate EVI membership. The briefing highlights that joining the EVI would present an opportunity for New Zealand to display leadership on climate change, as well as send a signal to the global EV sector that New Zealand is “EV ready”. It would also provide an avenue for sharing policy best practice with countries leading EV markets, as well as for engaging with the Clean Energy Ministerial and Mission Innovation (high-level dialogues among Energy Ministers from the world’s major economies) in the future.

### Domestic

#### 2.1. Beef+Lamb launches environment strategy

Beef+Lamb New Zealand has announced an aspirational goal for the sector to be carbon-neutral by 2050. The announcement, made as part of their new environment strategy, notes that emissions from the sector are already 30 per cent lower than they were in 1990, achieved through improved efficiency combined with decreasing stock numbers.

Planting trees will be a key part of meeting this goal, and Beef+Lamb will support the industry with other initiatives. The strategy also sets goals for managing and improving water quality, soil erosion and biodiversity loss. Central to this is their proposal for developing an on-farm environmental decision-making tool for farmers. They are looking at a 12 to 18 month timeframe for delivery on this. We are meeting with Beef+Lamb next week to learn more about the strategy and their on-farm tool.

Beef+Lamb's climate change goal is in line with the Farmers Leaders Group goal of "zero net carbon" from agri-food by 2050. You (and other ministers) are meeting with this group next week.

#### 2.2. New report released urges the Bank of England to do more on climate change

Positive Money, a not-for-profit research and campaigning organisation based in London has released a new report titled *A Green Bank of England, Central Banking for a Low-Carbon Economy*.

The report is supportive of the steps that the Bank of England (BoE) has taken so far, which have primarily been to lead the discussion about the role of central banks in relation to climate change. However, it criticises the BoE for only looking at climate change in relation to its impacts on risk and financial stability, ignoring how climate change interacts with its other roles.

The report argues that central banks, as institutions tasked with supporting the public good, should contribute to raising private and public finance to close the significant 'green investment gap'. It argues that the BoE's approach is incoherent, both over time and across different forms of policy (i.e. financial stability and monetary policy) because it is failing to take account of the costs of physical and transition risk that will result if action is not taken now. It notes that monetary policy since the financial crisis has unintentionally privileged high-carbon sectors, contradicting the BoE's own concern over climate risk.

One of the key recommendations is for a review of the monetary policy framework to assess its interactions with climate objectives, and to consider allowing the Monetary Policy Committee to promote decarbonisation with future monetary policy interventions.

In New Zealand, the Reserve Bank's mandate in relation to climate change is being investigated as part of phase 2 of the review. However, the focus of this review is how climate change may impact financial stability. s 9(2)(f)(iv)

### 2.3. Report on Climate Change and Environmental Health

A report "Climate Change and Environmental Health", commissioned by the Ministry of Health, identifies a number of health risks and recommends that plans be put in place for mitigating or adapting to these effects. This report will significantly contribute to the assessment of climate change-related health risks as part of the upcoming National Climate Change Risk Assessment. It was prepared by ESR (the Institute of Environmental Science and Research), New Zealand's Crown Research Institute that specialises in science relating to people and communities.

Climate change is most likely to worsen environmental health risks that already exist including: exposure to air irritants and pollutants, extreme weather events, exposure to (or lack of) ultra-violet solar radiation, potential establishment of vector-borne diseases and illnesses related from exposure to toxins, water-borne and infectious diseases. New risks are more likely to occur under high global emission scenarios. There are also a number of indirect impacts on health such as increased water and food insecurity and population migration.

Addressing knowledge gaps will be critical to informing adaptation planning and policy and to reduce future climate related risks to health.

### 2.4. Productivity Commission to look into local government funding

Local Government Minister Nanaia Mahuta announced on Friday 11 May that the Government will ask the Productivity Commission to hold an inquiry into local government funding, to look at how local government can fund its activities most effectively and fairly.

"Local government is facing increasing costs for things like three waters, roading, housing, and tourism infrastructure as well as adapting to climate change. And some of the councils facing the biggest cost increases also have shrinking rating bases," Minister Mahuta said. "Rates are rising faster than incomes so simply raising rates is not the solution."

The inquiry is expected to start in August 2018 and present a final report mid-2019 after consulting with local government and infrastructure sectors. The terms of reference are still being finalised and will be released when agreed with the Productivity Commission.

## International

### 2.5. Update on California Global Climate Action Summit

The genesis of the Summit was former UNFCCC Executive Secretary Christiana Figueres' request to Governor Jerry Brown to convene an event on sub-national action in 2018 to inspire national governments to go beyond their current commitments when they (re-)communicate NDCs in 2020. In light of the US administration's plans to withdraw from the Paris Agreement, and the heightened global attention on US domestic action, Governor Brown has added a global focus to the scope of the Summit and is seeking national government representation.

To date, a select group of 25 governments have been identified for invitation under four broad categories: California's strong bilateral partners; countries that have given national endorsement to the 'Under2 MoU' (sub-national climate pledge); high-ambition countries; and high emitters. We understand the group includes: Canada, Mexico, Costa Rica, Chile, Argentina, UK, France,

Germany, South Africa, India, China, Viet Nam, Fiji, Marshall Islands, Barbados, Norway, Denmark, Morocco.

New Zealand fits under the high ambition category. In addition, we understand the organisers are looking to invite a number of New Zealand entities: Auckland (Mayor Phil Goff), as a C40 city, and on the business side, possibly a combination of Air New Zealand, Enviro-Mark Solutions, the Australia and NZ Banking Group, Mercury and the Warehouse Group. The organisers of the Summit have invited us to suggest a few more New Zealand entities.

The Summit will involve plenary sessions and break-out groups, to be co-chaired by Governor Brown, Patricia Espinosa (UNFCCC Executive Secretary) and Anand Mahindra (chair of Mumbai-based business conglomerate Mahindra Group). National representatives will be invited to make statements at the plenary session, showcasing the progress their countries have made. The high-level plenary will end with a call to action to national governments on behalf of participants. The record of the event will be an input to a UN Secretary General's Summit next year, focused on providing a qualitative assessment of what sub-national commitments mean.

There will be five themes for the official events, with lead organisations as follows:

- Clean energy and transport (Climate Group);
- Inclusive economic growth and Just transition (We mean Business, Business for Social Responsibility and Corporate Social Responsibility - CSR);
- Sustainable communities for all (C40 et al);
- Natural and landscape stewardship (WWF); and
- Transformative Climate Investment (CERES).

#### Domestic

#### 2.1. Work with Hawkes Bay Regional Council and OECD on approaches to climate change adaptation

Most countries are grappling with how to fund climate adaptation and a range of approaches are being implemented. The OECD is currently writing a report titled "Responding to rising seas: comparing OECD countries' approaches to coastal adaptation" which will include approaches to financing. The report is due to be published in 2019. We have been working with the OECD on this and are writing a case study with the Hawkes Bay Regional Council outlining their approach to coastal hazards and climate change in Clifton to Tangoio. The UK, Canada and France are also providing case studies to outline what is happening in their countries and we are receiving

early drafts of their case studies. This report will provide us with useful insights into what other likeminded countries are doing and help inform our thinking.

On Thursday last week you launched the CCATWG Group's recommendations. For your information, the key areas of interest from those at the launch and in the media were:

- When is a national climate change risk assessment going to be delivered; and
- When and how will the groups funding recommendations be implemented

## International

### 2.2. Regional Workshop on Low Emissions Livestock in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia

A workshop is being held 2–4 July in Addis Ababa to raise regional awareness of developments in low emissions livestock that offer opportunities to achieve economic gains at the same time as responding to climate change. The event is being hosted by the Global Research Alliance on Agricultural Greenhouse Gas Emissions (GRA) together with the CGIAR Research Programme on Climate Change, Agriculture and Food Security (CCAFS), the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) and the World Bank. The event is targeted at senior government, policy and science representatives working in the livestock sector in East Africa. The aims of the event are to:

- Discuss countries' ambitions and challenges regarding climate change and agriculture development;
- Showcase the ongoing work of the four organisations that focuses on improving productivity, reducing greenhouse gas emissions, enhancing resilience, and strengthening measurement, reporting and verification of low emissions livestock systems;
- Understand how science underpins this work, including helping to support countries' Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs); and
- Identify ways that the GRA, CCAFS, FAO and World Bank can help build regional and national capacity through tailored initiatives.

MFAT is supporting the event by assisting with securing key invitees and using the opportunity to strengthen relationships with East African contacts, including the new Ethiopian Minister of Agriculture.
