 - b. enable the Interim Committee to continue operating until the establishment of the Climate Change Commission.

- 4. The current draft of the paper incorporates feedback on the first draft, as discussed with you on Monday 6 May. It is no longer proposed to be a joint paper with the Minister of Agriculture.
- 5. The main change to the paper is the inclusion of a new proposal for legislation to provide a firm commitment to ensuring a price incentive at farm level is achieved, without prematurely closing off options for how best to implement this.
- 6. This change reflects our advice that:
 - a. the government is not in a position now to agree to legislate for a mandatory farm level emissions reporting date of 2023 and a farm level levy or ETS surrender obligation by 2025, as recommended by the Interim Committee
 - providing a strong emissions pricing signal at farm level to incentivise and reward good farm management practices that reduce greenhouse gas emissions is the desired long-term outcome
 - c. it is important to provide clarity and increased certainty through legislation of the intention to ensure a price incentive at farm level, even though the exact timing and how best to transition to that end-point requires further work and consultation (including the joint programme of work with the sector as proposed by the Interim Committee).

 - a. **Agree** that it is important to provide clarity and increased certainty that a strong emissions pricing signal at farm level is the intended long-term policy outcome, and that a firm commitment to achieve this should be included in legislation as proposed in the draft Cabinet paper

- 5. The main change to the paper is the inclusion of a new proposal for legislation to provide a firm commitment to signal a transition to a price incentive at farm level, while ensuring flexibility for how best to implement this and when.
- 6. This change reflects our advice that:
 - a. it is important to provide clarity and increased certainty through legislation of the intention to ensure a price incentive at farm level,
 - b. There is flexibility on the exact timing and the choice of pricing scheme at the farm level (to be informed by consultation and the joint programme of work with the sector as proposed by the Interim Committee).
- We also added paragraphs in the draft Cabinet paper (paragraph 7, 29, and recommendation 26) to explain how the policy proposals align with the split gas targets to be set in legislation in the Zero Carbon Bill.

- 8. We recommend that you:
 - a. Agree that it is important to:
 - provide clarity and increased certainty through legislation of the intention to ensure a price incentive at farm level,
 - ensure flexibility on the exact timing and the choice of pricing scheme at the farm level (to be informed by consultation and the joint programme of work with the sector as proposed by the Interim Committee).

Updated discussion document and timeframes for consultation on agriculture

- 1. This briefing provides for your feedback and direction:
 - a. an updated draft discussion document, Action on agricultural emissions (Appendix 1)
 - b. timeframe options for incorporating relevant decisions on agriculture in the Climate Change Response Amendment Bill (CCRAB).
- 2. Our advice is presented in the context of the Government's preference for any legislative changes resulting from Cabinet decisions on agriculture and climate change policy to be included in the Climate Change Response Amendment Bill (CCRAB), section 9(2)(f) iv

Updated draft discussion document

- 3. section 9(2)(f)(iv) this version of the discussion document now describes two options considered by the Interim Committee as an interim measure for agriculture in the transition to a farm-level pricing scheme by 2025:
 - i. processor-level obligations in the New Zealand Emissions Trading Scheme (NZ ETS)
 - ii. a formal agreement between the Government and agricultural sector, with specific commitments for action and investment emissions reduction.
- 4. Both options are presented in the discussion document without the Government's preferred option to seek feedback from sector stakeholders, iwi/Māori and the general public. However, our advice to date has aligned with the Interim Committee's recommendation for a processor-level price on agricultural emissions in the NZ ETS, as an interim measure (see 2019-B-05536).
- 5. We note the Ministry for the Environment and Ministry for Primary Industries are in the process of preparing a joint aide-memoire, with advice on the necessary elements that should be included in a formal agreement. This aide-memoire will be provided separately to you and the Minister of Agriculture.
- 6. We recommend meeting with officials as soon as possible to discuss the changes to the draft discussion document, as well as our advice in the joint aide-memoire, prior to any consultation with ministerial colleagues.

Updated draft discussion document

- 2. The draft discussion document has been updated following the meeting with the Primary Sectors Leaders Group (Leaders Group) the Prime Minister, and yourself, last week.
- 3. We have tracked changes in the discussion document which reflect the Leader Group's proposal
- 4. We have also included further detail for the impacts of pricing livestock emissions at the farm level. This detail is necessary to meet likely RIS requirements.
- 5. Due to the timeframe, officials recommend that you provide feedback on these changes by 12pm Wednesday 19 June.

Updated Cabinet paper on proposed action on agricultural emissions for ministerial consultation

- 1. This briefing provides you with an updated version of the draft Cabinet paper, Consultation on Government's proposed action on agricultural emissions (Appendix 1), for ministerial consultation.
- We require any feedback from ministerial consultation by midday Wednesday 26 June to allow for late lodgement to Environment, Energy and Climate (ENV) Committee meeting on Thursday 27 June. We note the Primary Sector Leaders Group is providing feedback on the draft discussion document at the same time.
- 3. We also advise on timing of final policy decisions through to the introduction of the Climate Change Response Amendment Bill (the Bill).

Updated draft Cabinet paper

- 4. Following your meeting with Ministers Parker and Jones on 19 June, and due to time constraints for the Bill, we have incorporated your directions to instruct the Parliamentary Counsel Office (PCO) to begin drafting all proposed legislative options, including:
 - pricing fertiliser emissions at processor level in the NZ ETS;
 - applying voluntary farm-level reporting on livestock emissions in the NZ ETS from 2023 and mandatory farm-level reporting from 2024;
 - enabling farm-level obligations on livestock emissions in the NZ ETS from 2025 (subject to an interim review requirement in 2022 regarding whether this timeframe is feasible);
 - both proposals for an interim measure:
 - o processor-level obligations for livestock emissions in the NZ ETS
 - o a formal agreement between the Government and agricultural sector.
