<b>Other authorisations that may be required from MPI</b>	This is an application for a land-based fish farm and if approved through FTA Bill will subsequently require a fish farm license issued by MPI under the Freshwater Fish Farming Regulations 1983. s 9(2)(b)(ii) [REDACTED]
<b>Aquaculture settlement considerations</b>	The Māori Commercial Aquaculture Claims Settlement Act is not relevant to this proposed activity.
<b>Fisheries settlement considerations</b>	There are no Fisheries Settlement issues with this application.
