

If a project is accepted for listing it will not need to go through a Ministerial referral process but instead can be lodged directly with the environmental protection authority for consideration by an expert consenting panel. This effectively streamlines the application process (by removing the referral step) but still requires a full consideration of the effects of the project and reporting on consultation as well as an opportunity for tangata whenua and directly affected landowners to provide comments.

The Ministers ultimately decide whether a project receives consent (or not) after considering the expert panel's recommendations.

As the person who will be responsible for iwi/hapu issues associated with the project I am keen to see that the tangata whenua perspective in terms of culture and environment is not lost in this process.

I will be in touch again to set up a hui where we can discuss the preliminary design and importantly, get your views but in the meantime, if you have any questions please just ask.

I'm getting in touch to let you know about a proposed wind farm proposal of around 62 turbines and which is to be established in the Mangapapa area. The wind farm site is on privately-owned farmland west of SH 36 between Tauranga and Rotorua. That land in the recent past has been plantation pine forest but subsequently has been converted to dairy farming or replanted with pine. (See attached map which might help you locate the project site) There is no record of there being any cultural sites associated with the properties, but you might well have concerns which we would like to hear about.

It is very early days with the development of the project but the intent of touching base with you is to confirm whether you have such interests in the area and if so, to establish a formal consultation process.
