Not sure where this leaves us for Fast Tracking. The Ngai Tahu settlement legislation is not in scope of Fast Track. Those provisions generally apply to acknowledge Ngai Tahu interest in the management of those species if transferred in or out. However they are a clear reflection of Treaty obligations to be upheld.

Separately, we are looking into the presence of those species in that area, but I won't have that information until tomorrow. We won't have time to consult on this now.

It would be good to understand the current status of applications; just as a heads up, to understand if anything else is coming our way.

FYI, in the interim I've put a high-level note in our advice which reads:

The Otututu Ecological Area is a habitat for Whio/Blue Duck and Roroa/Great Spotted Kiwi, and the Otututu Scenic Reserve supports a large population of Mātā/South Island Fernbird. These are all taonga species under the Ngāi Tahu Settlements Act 1998. Under s293 of this Act, the Minister for Conservation must "consult with, and have particular regard to the views of, Te Rūnanga o Ngāi Tahu" regarding "proposals for the transfer of a taonga species into or from the Ngāi Tahu claim area or methods of control or protection of a taonga species."

However, given the specifics of the project I'm not entirely sure if S293 is relevant or a factor in the advisory group's decision as to whether to list this project.

Hi Max

I have checked; the proposed penstock would cross a substantial proportion of Paparoa National Park specially protected area, which appears to render it ineligible for Fast Track. It doesn't look like the route can avoid that area but it may be possible.

I suggest the initial assessment for the Rough (Otututu) River Hydroelectric Power Scheme is that it is ineligible for consideration under Fast Track due to its needing to cross National Park land.
