Please find below DOC advice on this Fast Track application.

There is no involvement of public conservation land of status which cannot be considered under Fast Track, so there are no grounds for ineligibility on that basis.

Conservation approvals will be required, however, for a number of parcels of public conservation land which are or may be affected by the project, which requires more detailed assessment as to the nature of the permissions required. If land requires disposal, this would trigger Ngāi Tahu first right of refusal.

Threatened native fish are likely affected by the project, which will require appropriate RMA and freshwater fishery approvals and lizards may be affected requiring Wildlife Act approvals.

There may be matters which require engagement with Ngāi Tahu, which we have not been able to undertake due to the confidentiality obligations.

Hi Neil:

1. Public Conservation Lands and Waters (pcl&w)

The proposal does not involve pcl&w that is subject to Schedule 4 of the Crown Minerals Act

However, the proposal would involve other forms of pcl&w.

(i) The Stoney Creek and Shepherds Hut Wildlife Management Reserve

Construction of a weir and associated infrastructure indicated as being located in the reserve would require a concession

Construction of weir may result in inundation of a part of the Stoney Creek and Shepherds Hut Wildlife Management Reserve.

MOC (landowner) approval for disposal or exchange of pcl&w (eg. for the purpose of inundation) has proved problematic in the past where land has conservation value. A concession for the same purpose would also appear problematic due to the values here.

(ii) The Rock and Pillar Conservation Area

A part of the Rock and Pillar Conservation Area at the north-eastern end of the Loganburn Reservoir may be inundated by the raise in height of the Loganburn Reservoir. The proposers would need to confirm the extent of inundation. MOC (landowner) approval for disposal or exchange of pcl&w (eg. for the purpose of inundation) has proved problematic in the past where land has conservation value. A concession for the same purpose would appear problematic due to the values here.

(iii) The Burgen Creek Marginal Strip

Indications from engagement with the proposers in 2018 were that this would not be required, however detail is not provided in the 2024 Fast Track Application if this has changed.

2. Treaty Settlement affected

Ngāi Tahu Right of First Refusal (RFR) would apply to the disposal of any public conservation land.

3. Other relevant matters

- The pcl&w created here were outcomes of the tenure review processes for Rocklands Station and Stonehurst Station. Key values sought for protection were the significant population of the Eldons Galaxiids (nationally endangered) in the trout-free Stoney Creek (trout predate galaxiids); and the vegetation, landscape and faunal values at the north-eastern end of the Loganburn Reservoir. As a result, the Stoney Creek and Shepherds Hut Wildlife Management Reserve was created; and an addition made to the Rock and Pillar Conservation Area.
- Inundation behind any weir would remove Eldons galaxiid habitat.

- In addition, trout may be introduced to the Stoney Creek via any race connection with the Loganburn.
- Potential adverse effects on freshwater values from low flow in the Sutton Creek should increased water take from the contributing Stoney and Burgen Creeks be sought
- Part of the Great Moss Swamp is located at the upper (southern) end of the Logan Burn Reservoir and would likely be inundated be affected/inundated (this is not pcl&w). This is a remnant of a previously more extensive wetland flooded by the current Loganburn Reservoir. The Otago Regional Council lists the Great Moss Swamp as a Regionally Significant Wetland.
- A Wildlife Act Permit would likely need to be sought for the purpose of catch alive or kill of protected wildlife (eg if lizard species are subject to inundation).
- The proposal may also raise issues under the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1993 which DOC administers.
- Te Mana o Taiari being a collaborative community project to restore the Taiari River in Otago ki uta ki tai, from mountains to sea
