We have a few applications for solar projects that we're assessing for impacts on Treaty settlement and other arrangements, and just keen to test with you whether the project attached to this email meets the criteria for projects you'd want to look at and provide feedback on.

For context, the application for FTA198 Tolaga Bay Solar Farm states,

"There is a small area of Heritage Alert Overlay located in the eastern corner of the site near the Uawa River. The heritage alert layer is used as an early warning system. In assessing consents the determining criteria will be the risk factor and likelihood of damage to archaeological sites.
