The project seeks to construct a temporary access road through adjoining DOC land to gain access to the aforementioned property to allow the harvest of 85 hectares of Pinus radiata.
What are the project details?

This project seeks to obtain approval to construct a short temporary access road across DOC land to provide the only economically viable access to harvest 85 hectares of pinus radiata plantation. An application to DoC for approval was initially approved (subject to Public notification) and later declined. The decision has left approximately security of radiata pine land locked and unable to be harvested. The partner owners were originally 10 couples who funded the forest through to maturity as a retirement investment and now include 5 widows.
The original project had relied on using the proposed access road which was at that time (1974) partly across Crown land and administered by the NZ Forest Service. The NZFS land was later transferred to DOC. While DOC were always supportive of the forest the application for access was declined based on the Supreme Court decision in the Ruataniwha Water Storage Scheme Case.
The activities include earthworks, mechanised forest harvesting and log freight transport. The purpose of this project is to improve the local economy through increased employment as well as supply domestic and export log markets.
