Is any PCL affected? In particular, is the project likely to	Yes, stewardship land - North Bank Arahura Road
affect a National Park, Wildlife or Forest Sanctuary, Nature or National Reserve, or Ramsar sites?	Conservation Area.
Would the site likely require any DOC approvals (eg Wildlife Act, Conservation Act, freshwater fisheries)	Yes, this requires disposal or exchange under s. 26 Conservation Act. As it currently stands it does not meet the criteria for disposal - Conservation General policy s. 6 – no or very low conservation value. An ecological assessment was made in 2020 concluding that the North Bank Arahura CA has significant and important ecological values that enhance the Hokitika Ecological District's protected natural area network
Do we know of any Treaty implications that MfE should be made aware of (eg, whether the site is relevant to a Terms of Settlement)?	There are no obligations under the treaty settlement related to this piece of land. The Department has been working with Ngāti Waewae to identify possible options that might support this proposal and Ngati Waewae's strategic goal of rebuilding their social and economic wellbeing in Te Tai Poutini. However, these discussions have not yet found a suitable outcome for all parties, primarily due to limitations under the

	existing conservation legislation and policy framework.
Any other matters	The current stewardship land review process recommended this land remain as stewardship land in order to support the aspirations for future papakainga housing

This listed project application is FTA#080 - Arahura Papakāinga Housing Project

The applicant notes project details as - A land exchange is proposed by Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Waewae and the Department of Conservation of approximately 105ha of Ngāi Tahu land around Lake Tarleton (adjacent to public conservation land at Mahināpua), for 74.5ha of public conservation land on the Old Christchurch Road, Hokitika:

Conservation Area- North Bank Arahura Road. The land exchange will enable the development of Papakāinga by Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Waewae beside their Marae. Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Waewae has been in negotiation with the Department of Conservation on this project for over ten years. The Department of Conservation is in support of the project however the legislative mechanisms under the Conservation Act 1987 have limited the ability for the project to progress.
