FTC#201: Application for referred project under the COVID-19 Recovery (Fast-track Consenting) Act 2020 – Stage 1 decisions

Key messages

- 1. This briefing seeks your initial decisions on an application from Manawatū-Whanganui Regional Council (Horizons) to refer the Arawhata Wetland Project (project) to an expert consenting panel (panel) under the COVID-19 Recovery (Fast-track Consenting) Act 2020 (the FTCA).
- 2. The project is to construct engineered treatment wetlands and restore previously drained natural wetlands in the Arawhata Stream catchment of Punahau/Lake Horowhenua in Manawatū-Whanganui. The project site covers an area of approximately 119 hectares, located at 269 and 308 Hokio Beach Road, 217 Arawhata Road, Levin and adjacent land (legally described as Section 4 Survey Office Plan 465440). The project will include works within the Hokio Beach Road and Arawhata Road reserves.
- 3. The project is to improve the water quality of Lake Horowhenua by reducing nitrogen, phosphorus and sediment loads entering the lake.
- 4. The project will require land use consent under the Horowhenua District Plan, water and discharge permits under the Horizons One Plan, and resource consents under the Resource Management (National Environmental Standards for Freshwater) Regulations 2020 (NES-F) and Resource Management (National Environmental Standard for Assessing and Managing Contaminants in Soil to Protect Human Health) Regulations 2011 (NES-CS). The proposed activities would have overall discretionary activity status.
- 5. We have undertaken an initial (Stage 1) analysis of the referral application, and this is presented along with our recommendations in Table A.
- 6. The project meets all the eligibility criteria in section 18(3) of the FTCA, but more analysis is needed before we can advise you if it meets the purpose of the FTCA (thus satisfying section 18(2) of the FTCA) and advise you on matters in section 23(5) which may influence your referral decision.
- 7. We recommend you progress consideration of the application to the next stage of analysis (Stage 2) and invite comments from Horowhenua District Council, Horizons Regional Council and specific Ministers listed in section 21(6) of the FTCA.
- 8. We recommend that you invite comments from First Gas Limited as an additional party under section 21(3) of the FTCA.
- 9. We also recommend you request further information from the Horowhenua District Council as detailed in Table A.

Statutory framework summary

- 10. You are the sole decision maker for the referral application as the project will not occur in the coastal marine area.
- 11. You may decline the referral application before seeking comments from the relevant local authorities and any relevant Ministers:
 - a. if you are satisfied the project does not meet the referral criteria in section 18 of the FTCA, (which include helping to achieve the purpose of the FTCA) (see sections 18(2) and 23(1) of the FTCA)
 - b. for any other reason (see section 23(2) of the FTCA).

- 12. If you do not decline the referral application at this stage:
 - a. you must provide the application to, and invite comments from, the relevant local authorities and the relevant Ministers prescribed by section 21(6) of the FTCA
 - b. you may provide the application to and invite comments from any other person.
- 13. You are also able to request further information from the applicant or any relevant local authority at any time before you decide to decline or accept the referral application (see section 22 of the FTCA).

Based on the information provided by the applicant, we consider the project may result in the following economic benefits: • creating approximately 45 direct full time equivalent (FTE) jobs over a 3-year construction period.	The project has the potential for positive effects on the social and cultural wellbeing of current and future generations as it will: • contribute to job creation and flowon economic benefits • restore a natural wetland • contribute to enhancement of water quality of Lake Horowhenua • provide opportunities for recreation and public amenity. The applicant notes the project has the potential for adverse environmental effects, including: • earthworks and construction effects • temporary ecological effects. We note that you do not require a full Assessment of Environment Effects and supporting evidence to make a referral decision and a panel can consider this and any appropriate mitigation, offsetting or compensation to manage adverse effects of the development.	The project site is located in the Rural Zone and meets the definition of highly productive land under the National Policy Statement for Highly Productive Land 2022 (NPS-HPL), having Class I and II soil overlays. However, the project is not considered by the applicant as an inappropriate use or development under NPS-HPL (Clause 3.9 (2)(c), (e) and (f)). We consider that the project will improve water quality and has the potential to restore natural resources. A gas transmission pipeline traverses the project site and a pipeline certificate (easement) associated with this is registered on the titles of 269 Hoko Beach Road and Section 4 Survey Office Plan 465440. We recommend you seek comments from First Gas Ltd whether the project will have any impact on the existing gas transmission pipeline.	 a.
