

HOUSING POLL July 2021

CLIENT: Glenpanel LP

POLL DATES: Wednesday 07 July to Monday 20 July 2021. The median

response was collected on Thursday 15 July 2021.

TARGET POPULATION: Residents of Queenstown Lakes District.

SAMPLE POPULATION: Residents of Queenstown Lakes District who are contactable

on a landline or mobile phone.

SAMPLE SIZE: 1,000 respondents agreed to participate.

SAMPLE SELECTION: A random selection of 12,000 phone numbers.

WEIGHTING: The results are weighted to reflect the overall Queenstown

Lakes District population in terms of gender, age, and area.

SAMPLE ERROR: Based on this sample of 1,000 respondents, the maximum

sampling error (for a result of 50%) is +/- 3.1%, at the 95% confidence level. For the question with 500 responses the

sampling error is +/- 4.4%

CODE COMPLIANCE: This poll was conducted in accordance with the Research

Association New Zealand Code of Practice and the

International Chamber of Commerce/European Society for Opinion and Market Research Code on Market and Social

Research.



EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- Housing affordability is seen as very important by a large majority of Queenstown Lakes
 District Residents with 63% calling it extremely or very important and only 13% as
 somewhat or not very important.
- Women are more concerned about housing affordability than men
- A large majority support new residential development that will provide more affordable housing with 62% in favour and only 26% opposed
- Net support (support less opposition) for new residential developments is +27% amongst current homeowners and +49% amongst renters.
- Residents believe the central Government, the local Council and the banks have all done
 poorly in keeping house prices affordable with 48% saying the Government is doing
 poorly, 41% the Council and 32% the banks. Only 4% say the Government is doing a
 good job, 11% for the Council and 15% for banks.
- Development of Ladies Mile is backed by a plurality of 42% with 37% opposed and 21% undecided.
- There is a strong difference by age in terms of support for Ladies Mile development. 54% of under 40s support it compared to 24% of over 60s.
- There is also a strong difference of support for Ladies Mile by current home ownership status. 32% of homeowners support it compared to 53% of renters.
