Summerset Rotorua	Summerset Villages (Rotorua) Limited	The Summerset Rotorua Project is to construct and operate a retirement village and a separate commercial hub on an approximately 14.2 hectare site located at 171-193 Fairy Springs Road, Fairy Springs, Rotorua. The retirement village provides approximately 280 independent living units, 100 units comprising assisted living suites, memory care suites and beds, and resident indoor and outdoor facilities. The commercial building provides for activities such as medical facilities, childcare, café, and convenience retail. The project includes separate parking areas for the retirement village and commercial hub, landscaping, stormwater management and temporary activities for staged construction.
33 Main Highway	Wakefield Group Holdings Ltd	The 33 Main Highway Project is to develop an approximately 4.6 hectare site located at 33 Main Highway, Ōtaki to subdivide land and construct approximately 143 residential units (stand-a-lone and semi-detached), and supporting infrastructure including roads, vehicle and pedestrian and cycle accessways, car-parking areas and three-waters services.
