COVID-19 Recovery (Fast-Track Consenting) Act 2020 – comments sought on referral application – Plimmerton Farm Stage One Project

The Minister for the Environment (Minister) has received an application from KM and MG Holdings Limited to refer the Plimmerton Farm Stage One Project (project) to an expert consenting panel (a panel) for consideration under the COVID-19 Recovery (Fast-track Consenting) Act 2020 (FTCA).

The purpose of the FTCA is to promote employment to support New Zealand's recovery from the economic and social impacts of COVID-19 and to support certainty of investment while continuing to promote the sustainable management of natural and physical resources.

The project is described in Appendix A and the application documents are in Attachment 1.

Waka Kotahi New Zealand Transport Agency (Waka Kotahi) may have an interest in the project because works are proposed within the State Highway 59 road reserve to form a new pedestrian/cycle crossing. Under delegated authority from the Minister and pursuant to section 21(3) of the FTCA, I invite Waka Kotahi's written comments on the referral application. A template is provided for this purpose in Attachment 2.

The above information is provided to you in confidence and as part of the statutory process set out in the FTCA. Please do not forward the application or request for comments to anyone outside your organisation.

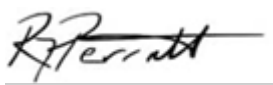
If the Minister accepts the application and the project is referred to a panel, the applicant will be able to lodge applications with the Environmental Protection Authority for the approvals needed under the Resource Management Act 1991. The applicant must provide a detailed assessment of environmental effects and cultural impact assessment(s) as part of this process.

Please provide comments via return email within 10 working days to ensure that the Minister takes them into consideration when deciding whether or not to accept the referral

application. Note that the Minister is not required to consider any comments provided after this time.

Appendix A - Proposed project

Project	Applicant	Details
Plimmerton Farm Stage One	KM and MG Holdings Limited	The project is to subdivide approximately 383-hectares of land located at 18 State Highway 59, Plimmerton, Porirua, and construct a residential development comprising of approximately 1044 residential units in a range of typologies, including approximately 305 units in approximately 35 apartment buildings up to 4 storeys high, and terraced, duplex and detached houses. Approximately 209 of the residential units will be constructed by third parties. The project will also create six super lots and a balance lot, and includes developing land for open space, reclamation of streams and natural inland wetlands, and ecological restoration. The project includes works within the James Street road reserve to upgrade site access and within the State Highway 59 road reserve to form a new pedestrian/cycle crossing, and the construction of supporting infrastructure, including roads and reserves intended to vest with Porirua City Council (PCC), accessways and three-waters services.
