COVID-19 Recovery (Fast-Track Consenting) Act 2020 – Rotokauri North – Stage 1 – Comments sought

In the week commencing 4 October 2021, Rotokauri North Holdings Limited applied to the Minister for the Environment (the Minister) to refer the Rotokauri North – Stage 1 project to an expert consenting panel (a panel) for consideration under the COVID-19 Recovery (Fast-track Consenting) Act 2020 (FTCA).

The Project is described below, and a link to all application documents is provided in the covering email.

The project is to establish the first part of a residential development planned for a greenfield site on the north-western outskirts of Hamilton at 289, 317, 329, 335 and 341 Te Kowhai Road and 350 and 372 Exelby Road. The project comprises subdivision of a site covering approximately 62 hectares to create approximately 400 residential lots, additional superlots and balance lots, and roads intended to be vested in the local authority. It also includes construction of 40 residential units on approximately 20 of the residential lots and the installation of necessary three waters infrastructure. One of the superlots will be for a primary school and the applicant is currently negotiating with the Ministry of Education regarding the purchase of that site.

The Project involves activities such as: demolition of buildings, subdivision of land, earthworks and vegetation clearance within 100m of a natural wetland, earthworks (including disturbance of contaminated land), reclamation of natural stream beds, diversions and takes of surface water and groundwater, discharges of surface water, groundwater, and stormwater and contaminants to land and water, installation of culverts in riverbeds, construction of dwellings, construction of roading and transport infrastructure and three waters services.

The applicant is seeking subdivision and land use consents under the Hamilton District Plan, land use consent under the Waikato District Plan, water and discharge permits under the Waikato Regional Plan and resource consents under the Resource Management (National

Environmental Standard for Freshwater) Regulations 2020 and the Resource Management (National Environmental Standard for Assessing and Managing Contaminants in Soil to Protect Human Health) Regulations 2011 to be determined for the Project through the fasttrack process.



On behalf of the Minister and pursuant to section 21(3) of the FTCA, I invite you to provide written comments on the referral application. A template is attached for this purpose.

Please provide your comments via return email within 10 working days to ensure that the Minister will take your comments into consideration when deciding on the referral application. Note that the Minister is not required to consider any comments provided after this time.

If the Minister decides to refer the project to a panel, the applicant will provide a detailed assessment of environmental effects with any resource consent applications that they lodge with the panel.
