# FTC #105: Application for referred project under the COVID-19 Recovery (Fast-track Consenting) Act 2020 – Stage 1 decisions

#### **Key Messages**

- 1. We seek your initial decisions on an application for referral of the Waimarie Street project (the Project) to an expert consenting panel (a panel) under the COVID-19 Recovery (Fast-track Consenting) Act 2020 (the FTCA), from Sanctum Projects Limited.
- 2. The Project is located at 43A and 45 Waimarie Street and 819 Riddell Road, Saint Heliers, Auckland.
- The Project is to redevelop three suburban properties covering approximately 7,300 square metres, to create approximately 58 residential lots accommodating approximately 58 terraced two to four-bedroom residential units between two and three storeys high.
- 4. The Project will involve subdivision, demolishing three residential dwellings and other structures, earthworks and construction of new residential buildings and associated infrastructure.
- 5. The Project will require subdivision and land use consents, water take and diversion permits under the Auckland Unitary Plan (AUP), and resource consents under the Resource Management (National Environmental Standards for Assessing and Managing Contaminants in Soil to Protect Human Health) Regulations 2011 (NES-CS).
- 6. The Project site is zoned Residential–Mixed Housing Suburban in the AUP. The proposed activities have overall restricted discretionary activity status, due to exceedance of permitted standards including density and building height.
- 7. We have undertaken an initial (Stage 1) analysis of the application, and this is presented along with our recommendations in Table A.
- 8. The Project meets all the eligibility criteria in section 18(3) of the FTCA, but more analysis is needed before we can advise you if it meets the purpose of the FTCA (thus satisfying section 18(2) of the FTCA) and advise you on matters in section 23(5) which may influence your referral decision.
- 9. We recommend you progress consideration of the application to the next stage of analysis (Stage 2) and invite comments from Auckland Council and specific Ministers listed in section 21(6) of the FTCA.

# Statutory Framework Summary

- 10. You are the sole decision maker for referral of the Project as it will not occur in the coastal marine area.
- 11. You may decline the referral application before seeking comments from the relevant local authorities and any relevant Ministers:
  - a. if you are satisfied the Project does not meet the referral criteria in section 18 of the FTCA, (which include helping to achieve the purpose of the FTCA) (see sections 18(2) and 23(1) of the FTCA
  - b. for any other reason (see section 23(2) of the FTCA).
- 12. If you do not decline the referral application at this stage:
  - a. you must provide the application to, and invite comments from, the relevant local

authorities and the relevant Ministers prescribed by section 21(6) of the FTCA

- b. you may provide the application to and invite comments from any other person.
- 13. You are also able to request further information from the applicant or any relevant local authority at any time before you decide to decline or accept the referral application (see section 22 of the FTCA).
